Korimako Slouch Beanie

Designed by Annoline Billies

MATERIALS:

- Zealana Rimu DK
(Blend of 60% Fine New Zealand Merino Wool and 40% New Zealand Brushtail Possum Fibre; 128m/140y; 50g ball)
- One ball each of shade: R21 Purple Karani & shade: R03 Riverbank
- 3.75mm & 4mm Knitting Needles
- Darning needle

GAUGE: 22sts x 28rows = 10cm on 4mm

FINISHED SIZE: One size fits most.

BEANIE PATTERN:

Using 3.75 mm needles cast on 146 stitches with Shade R03 Riverbank

Rib Pattern:

Row 1: Knit 2, Purl 2

Row 2: Purl 2, Knit 2

Repeat this Rib Row 1 and Row 2, 3 more times
Change to R21 Purple Karani and work another 6 rows of Rib Row 1 and Row 2

Next Row: K11, K2tog *K1, K2tog repeat from * to last 10 sts, K10 (104 sts)

Change to 4mm needles

Work 49 rows Stocking Stitch

Shape Crown

1st Row: K1, K2tog (K5, K2tog – 14 times) K3 (90 sts)

2nd Row and every following alternative row Purl

3rd Row: K1, K2tog (K4, K2tog – 14 times) K1 (75 sts)

5th Row: K1, K2tog (K3, K2tog – 14 times) K1 (60 sts)

7th Row: K1, K2tog (K2, K2tog – 14 times) (45 sts)

9th Row: K1, K2tog 15 times (30 sts)

11th Row: K2tog 15 times (15 sts)

12th Row: P1, (P2tog – 7 times) (8 sts)

Break off yarn, leaving end long enough to sew seam, then thread end through remaining 8 sts, draw up and secure

Sew up seam reversing seam at rib to allow seam to be underneath when rib is turned back

Weave in any ends to complete.

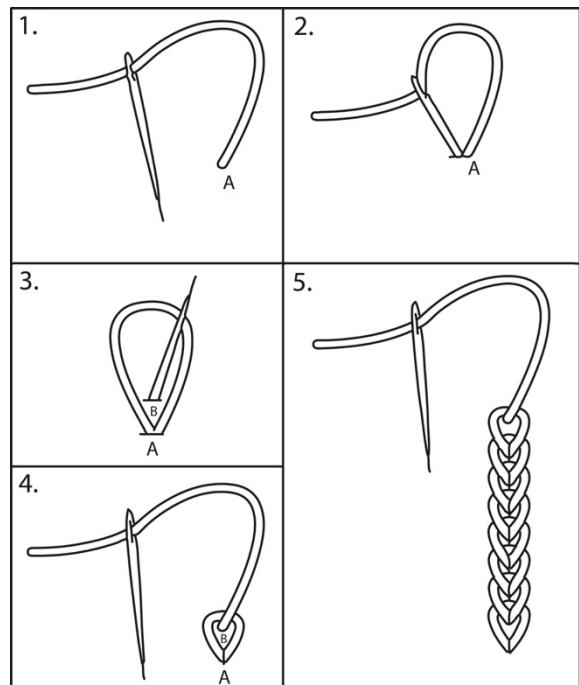
CHAIN STITCH:

Starting from the crown stitch up through the beanie (A) and pull the yarn all the way through

Stitch down into stitch A, do not pull your yarn all the way through

Stitch up at the top of the loop (B) and tighten the loop

Continue Chain Stitch 7cm or to desired length



Knitting Abbreviations:

K Knit

m1 Make 1 stitch by picking up the loop in between stitches and knit into the back of this loop.

P Purl

1 x 1 Rib K 1 stitch, P 1 stitch, repeat.

sts Stitches

Stocking Stitch

Knit 1 row, Purl 1 row, repeat.

Turn Turn your needles to work on the other side as you would a new row.
